Thank you for purchasing my \$5,000 a Week Slots Secrets. This method was designed to provide you ó the slots player ó with a quick and easy way to profit from several classes of slot machines commonly found in casinos, etc.

First, we must start out by defining the most important of the common classes of slot machines, and give you what we feel is an appropriate õpayoff potential ratingö or (PPR) for each of those classes. The PPR is rated from A to F with õAö being the highest rating and, at the other end of the spectrum õFö being the lowest rating.

- 1) Solid Bar or 777 Type Slots. We put this class first because they deserve our highest or õAö payoff potential rating. Typically, these are 3 to 5 coin / credit machines. This class can run from pennies to dollars machines.
- 2) Black Jack Slots. This is another excellent class. Often you will find that it can pay off an even or better return for each dollar invested. This deserves our õB+ö payoff potential rating.
- 3) Draw / Video Poker Slots. We like this class too. But, not as much as the Black Jack, Bar or 777 Type Slots and give it a õBö payoff potential rating. This is due to its often significantly lower payoff amounts relative to the amount wagered.
- 4) Fruit Shapes Slots. This class tends to have a less consistent payoff frequency than classes 1) to 3) and we must therefore give it a õCö payoff potential rating. Some payoffs may be good but the return on investment is inconsistent with this class.
- 5) Progressive Slots. Perhaps it should go without saying that this is our least favorite class of slots. It is essentially a õcasino come-onö class of slots for the wishful dreamers that think they can plunk down a few bucks and

walk away a millionaire. Now don't get me wrong ó some folks do win big at the progressive machines, but most people lose their money. We give this class a 5D-öpayoff potential rating.

## **The Leading Cycle Indicator (LCI) Strategy**

We have just recently developed the unique Leading Cycle Indicator (LCI) strategy to help players gain an advantage over our favorite class of slots: the Solid Bar or 777 Type slot machines.

What this strategy involves is quite simple. You are always looking to maximize the number of coins (or credits) played on each pull of a Solid Bar or 777 Type slot machines except on the condition of a new Leading Cycle Indicator (LCI) from the specific machine being played.

This indicator is a center pay line with only one (1) or no symbols present. In this situation the machine is potentially setting up for a release following the second consecutive pull with two (2) or more symbols present on the center pay line.

Therefore, what the smart player will do is to 5reduceö the coin (or credit) played to only one (1) until the second consecutive pull presents an opportunity to once again maximize the number number of coins (or credits) that can be played.

In this manner, the informed play will be positioned to reap the maximum payout potential of the machine when a winning pull is presented on the display.

Should the second consecutive pull prove not to be a winning pull, the player must back down just one (1) coin (or credit) for the following two pulls, then examine the center pay line for at least one (1) symbol present.

If no symbols are present at all on the center pay line, the player must again 5reduceö the coin (or credit) played to only one (1) until the second consecutive pull presents another opportunity to maximize the number of coins (or credits) that can be played.

However, if two (2) symbols are now present at all on the center pay line, OR two symbols are now present on the pay line directly above or below the center pay

line, the player should play no more than two (2) coins (or credits) for the next 2 pulls.

This simple strategy can provide you with many more "free" pulls as we like to call it by maximize the amount that can be won while minimizing session losses.

### **The Split-Line Side (S-LS) Strategy**

This is another hot new strategy that we have just put together for both Black Jack and Video / Draw Poker Class Slots. The Split-Line Side (S-LS) strategy is designed to help players gain an advantage over our next best rated classes of slots: the Black Jack and Video / Draw Poker Class slot machines.

What we are looking for here are split similar matching symbols on the center pay line. When we see the same symbol (e.g. King of Spades on the right and the King of Diamonds on the left or a character pair), we want to play no more than 2 coins (or credits) until a third similar matching symbol appears on the pay line directly above the center pay line, but not when the similar matching symbol appears on the pay line directly above AND below the center pay line on the same pull.

In the event that both similar match symbols appear above and below the center pay line while two of the same symbols appear on the center pay line we want to reduce our wager to just 1 coin (or credit) for the next consecutive pull.

The ideal situation is when we find a complimentary preceding symbol or in our example this would be the queen of hearts on the pay line directly above the center pay line while the same symbol (e.g. King of Spades on the right and the King of Diamonds on the left) appears. Then you can wager the maximum number of coins (or credits).

In this circumstance (but not when that complementary preceding symbol appears on the pay line directly below the center pay line) we would play the maximum number of coins (or credits) until no similar matching symbol card appears on the center pay line, or the pay lines directly above and below the center pay line.

When four (4) or more of a similar matching symbol appear on mixed pay lines but of course, not on the same pay line, reduce the number of coins (or credits) played to just two (2) until the prior "ideal" situation occurs again on the next 10 pulls. If the ideal situation does not occur within the next 10 pulls, reduce the number of coins (or credits) played to just 1 coin (or credit) for the next 5 pulls only.

Then increase it again to 2 coins (or credits) for the next 10 pulls always looking for the "ideal" situation to occur once again so that you can wager the maximum number of coins (or credits).

### **The Hit-or-Miss (H-M) Strategy**

This is an odd-named strategy, but none-the-less a very important well conceived approach to all slot classes that we deemed below "B" in potential payoff rating. The Hit-or-Miss (H-M) strategy was put together to help players carve out wins against low potential payoff: Fruit Shaped and Progressive class machines. These are tough classes of slots to play against and your goal, as always is to leave the machines with more money than you started with.

What we must do here is to divide your total wagering stake into multiple smaller stakes "x" each to be applied in different playing sessions. If the stake for a specific session is used up, you must quit playing.

For example, on a weekend trip, you may choose to have two sessions each day - two on Saturday and two on Sunday. That would mean that you would divide your bankroll into four equal amounts. If you arrived with \$200, then you would allocate just \$50 (or \$200 divided by 4) to each session.

Now, when you play your chosen machine "x" and, it should be a 4 (or greater) wheel machine. You should play just 1 coin / credit and look for a match on center symbols.

When this occurs you should maximize the following wager, reducing the wager by one credit until a win occurs.

For example, if two peaches occur side by side (on wheels 2 and 3) of a four wheel machine. You would increase your wager from 1 coin / credit to the maximum.

If you win that play, then stay at the maximum. Otherwise reduce the wager by 1 coin / credit until either 1) a win occurs, or 2) another side by side condition occurs, or 3) you return to 1 coin / credit for your wager.
